Day 4
Well, the US Open proved to be a test of survival.... A test not passed by the likes of Furyk, Tiger, and McDowell. Harrington and Els made runs during the final round... but Els made two bogeys after his eagle, and Harrington bogeyed 18 when he needed a birdie. And so Webb Simpson wins his first major without benefit of a birdie in his last 8 holes.
